It's a quarter to **three**.



It's ____ o'clock.

It's **eleven** o'clock.

It's half past...

It's half past **seven**.



You can also answer the question "What time is it?" using the structure below:

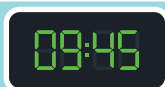
It is (It's) + hour + minutes

Analog and digital clock



It's half past two = It's two thirty.

Analog and digital clock



It's quarter to ten = It's nine forty five.

Analog and digital clock



It's seventeen past one = It's one seventeen

PREPOSITIONS. What time do you...?



What time do you go to school?

I go to school **at** half past eight.
I take the bus **at** ten past eight.

What time do you have classes?

I have classes **from** half past eight **to** two past ten.

- You use **at** when you speak about a specific hour.
- You use **from... to** when you speak about a range of time.
